

Employment Survey Report April 1985



PREFACE


This is the thirty-first Employment Survey conducted in Gibraltar and the twenty-fourth under the Statistics Ordinance (Employment Survey Order 1971) 1970. With frontier normalisation, it was felt that the survey should regularly monitor the nature and size of the likely influx of persons residing in Spain but who will be employed in Gibraltar. These employees are normally classified as "frontier workers." The Statistics (Employment Survey) (Amendment) Order 1985 was therefore introduced with effect from the 1st April 1985 to include an additional question on country of residence of employees.

This Survey is of particular interest, having been conducted barely a few months after the formal start of dockyard commercialisation and the full opening of the frontier. As was generally expected, the survey results reveal some interesting changing trends in the pattern of employment and earnings.

I must record my thanks to all those employers who co-operated in this survey.

1. COVERAGE

1.1 In April 1985 all known employers were sent Employment Survey questionnaires in respect of employees. Since June 1985 the information received has been processed manually and after sending out three reminders to late respondents, the survey was finally closed in August 1985. The tabulation of the data was completed during September 1985. Response was good and only a small number of employers were excluded in the final tabulation.

2. SUMMARY OF THE RESULTS

- 2.1 The findings of the April 1985 Employment Survey give a fairly reliable account of the income and employment effect of closure of the naval dockyard and its commercialisation as well as the short-run impact of frontier normalisation. The survey recorded a total of just under 11300 persons in employment. This represents an increase of some 180 over the level recorded in October 1984.
- 2.2 The main employment trends during this six-monthly period can be summarised as follows:-
 - (a) employment in the naval dockyard fell by around 600, mostly adult male industrial employees. Of these 400 were Gibraltarians. This completed an overall fall in M.O.D. (Navy) employment of some 1000 employees since April 1983, when the general rundown in employment in this sector initially began to manifest itself;
 - (b) employment in the new commercial shipprepair company increased by some 400, rising to a total of over 600 by April 1985. In general terms, the figures confirm the expected large shift in employment from the naval to the commercial yard;
 - (c) employment in the private sector as a whole has risen by just under 700 employees. This imcludes the additional 400 jobs taken up in the new commercial yard. Having regard to survey response, and slight seasonal fluctuations in employment, it is estimated that between 200 to 250 new private sector jobs have been created, excluding those in the new shiprepair company. This largely reflects the more immediate effects

of the opening of the frontier. In net terms, the overall increase was mainly in part-time employment. The increases were in the retail industry (notably the food sector), the hotel and catering sector and, to a lesser extent, in financial services. This growth in private employment relates mainly to clerical and service work;


- (d) there was a slight increase in Gibraltar Government employment with the recruitment of additional customs and administrative staff in those areas directly related with the new demands created by the full frontier opening;
- (e) there were more Gibraltarians in employment (+260), and less Moroccans (-129). The number of Spanish employees rose by around 50;
- (f) a total of 110 employees were classified as "frontier workers". This includes 45 Spaniards, 45 UK nationals and 18 Gibraltarians. The majority (98) were employed in the private sector, mainly in the hotel and catering trade and the construction industry;

At the time of writing this report, the indications are of a continuing rising employment trend. To date, more persons have been employed in the commercial yard (+80). There has been a noticeable increase in the number of new company registrations. The job vacancy level remains high. The October 1985 Survey should therefore provide a more complete and stabilised picture of the impact of dockyard commercialisation and frontier normalisation.

2.3 Average weekly earnings for full-time men fell marginally between October 1984 and April 1985. This is almost entirely accounted for by the substantial drop in the level of overtime work in the Ministry of Defence sector. This was extraordinarily high in the final months prior to dockyard closure. An interesting feature of the earnings pattern is the parity established between average weekly earnings in the official (£123.23) and private (£122.93) sectors. This is mainly the arithmetic result of the re-classification of the shiprepair activity from the official to the private sector. However, it also reflects higher earnings levels elsewhere in the private sector, notably in the wholesale/ retail trade and the transport sector. This pattern appears to be

mirrored in the case of weekly-paid women, and more extensively across industries for all monthly-paid employees, where earnings differentials between official and private sectors narrowed and relatively higher earnings were enjoyed in many areas of private sector activity. The most noticeable improvement in earnings was attributable to sales workers.

2.4 Taking the level of average earnings of full-time weekly-paid Gibraltarians, it is estimated that average "take home" pay for a married couple with two children, fell marginally (-0.8%) between October 1984 and April 1985. In real terms, this represents a drop of around 3.4%. The corresponding real drop for all full-time Gibraltarian adult males was 3.6%.
