


#### **BIRTHS BY AGE OF MOTHER, 2010**




#### LIFE EXPECTANCY, 2001

#### MARRIAGES, 1998 - 2010




#### MARRIAGES IN GIBRALTAR, 1999 - 2010



### **DISTRIBUTION OF HOUSEHOLDS, 2001**

















#### NUMBER OF CALLS HANDLED, 2003 - 2010








**RECEPTIONS INTO PRISON, 2000 - 2010**

RECEPTIONS INTO PRISON BY AGE 16 - 25, 2003 - 2010






#### TOURIST EXPENDITURE, 1999 - 2010






#### TOTAL DEPOSITS, 1993 - 2010






#### TOTAL YEARLY RAINFALL, 2005 - 2010
