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INTRODUCTION

The object of the Abstract is to provide a selection of statistics, in one compact volume, on topics of interest. Most of the information in this Annual Abstract is published separately, by a number of official departments and other authoritative sources and is already in the public domain. Current data for many of the tables appearing in this Abstract are contained in other Reports published by the Statistics Office, such as the Tourist Survey, Hotel Occupancy Survey and Employment Survey. A number of population statistics have been taken from the 2012 Census, due to be published by the Statistics Office.




Chart 2.02 Civilian Population of Gibraltar, 1961, 1970, 1981, 1991, 2001 and 2012







Table 2.08 Population by Religion, 1970, 1981, 1991 and 2001









Female Population by Nationality, 2001




Table 2.13 Registered Live Births in Gibraltar, 1982 - 2013









Table 2.18Life Expectancy, 1981, 1991 and 2001





Marriages in Gibraltar, 2013









Distribution of Households by the Number of Persons and the Number of Rooms per Household, 2001





Receptions into Prison by Age, 2013








Number of Calls Handled, 2013















Revenue & Expenditure, 2002 - 2015





2012 - 2013














Chart 18.04 Monthly Maximum and Minimum Air Temperatures, 2012 - 2013








