#### 1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1. The results of the Tourist Survey provide a sound basis for:
- (a) the formulation of the Tourist Office's marketing strategy.
- (b) the analysis of the Tourist market to Gibraltar.
- (c) monitoring the development of tourism in Gibraltar.
- (d) the calculation of tourist expenditure.

#### 1.2. Methodology

### (a) Sampling method

The 1976/77 Tourist Survey was run on the lines of previous surveys.

A system of quota sampling was used which precluded the estimation of sampling errors.

The sampling unit was the <u>party</u> of one or more persons travelling together and visiting Gibraltar for business or holiday.

A total of 1527 interviews were satisfactorily completed, divided as follows:

# (b) Timing

The survey was conducted between the 1st July 1976 and the 31st June, 1977.

It took account of seasonality of the holiday arrangements made by the different sampling units.

Visitors were interviewed at the following points of departure.

- Gibraltar airport (UK and Morocco flights)
- North and South Moles (Cruise Ships)
- Waterport Wharf (Gibraltar Tangier ferry)

#### GENERAL

as expected, the economic recession in the United Kingdom, with a high level of unemployment and a fall in real disposable incomes, had a serious effect on Gibraltar's tourist trade. Tourism receipts in 1976 were £4.5 million compared to £4.4 million in 1975 marking a decrease of around 10% in real terms. 1976 was a particularily bad year for hotels. Tourist arrivals at hotels fell by 27% and guest-nights sold by 20%. Hotel expenditure rose by only 5%, from £1.3 million in 1975 to £1.4 million in 1976. The real level of spending by visitors would have dropped further had it not been for increased receipts from visiting yachts and excursionists from Morocco. Indeed expenditure by excursionists from Morocco totalled £416,000, an increase of 76% compared to 1975. This was largely attributable to increased expenditure by shoppers who were by far the highest spenders of visitors to Gibraltar - the number of shopping excursionists rose from 3700 in 1975 to 6040 in 1976 and their expenditure more than doubled from £130,000 in 1975 to £283,000 in 1976. However, the number of yachts calling at Gibraltar rose by 16% and their expenditure by 30%. Spending by cruise passengers, usually a steady growing source of income, fell slightly (from £447,000 in 1975 to £437,000 in 1976, which was particularily disappointing in view of the 10% increase in the number of cruise passengers arriving at Gibraltar.

The reduction in the number of scheduled flights from London and continued wage restraint in the UK together with the extra competitive edge gained by Spanish resorts following the devaluation of the peseta will tend to dampen prospects for tourism in 1977.

## How long and where they stayed

The average length of stay of visitors arriving from UK was 7 days, as in 1975/76. For inclusives, average length of stay was 7 days (8 days during the summer period). Visitors from Morocco stayed 2 days on average; the majority having arrived for an excursion and/or shopping trip for the day only.

Nearly all holiday-makers arriving from UK stayed in hotels featured by Tour Operators; half the total stayed in beach hotels. Holidaymakers making independent arrangements were more inclined to stay in Town hotels.

#### How much they spent

Holidaymakers arriving by air from UK spent an average of £7.3 per person per day (£6.3 in 1975/76). Shopping visitors from Morocco were the highest spenders-nearly £47 per person per day. Businessmen were the highest spending group amongst UK arrivals, with an average expenditure of £9 per person per day.

Tourist expenditure for 1976 was estimated at £4.5 million, an increase of 3% over 1975. In real terms however tourist expenditure fell by 10% between 1975 and 1976. Detailed calculations of tourist expenditure is attached at Appendix 'A'.

#### What type of tourist

Around 70% of visitors interviewed were over the age of 35, 20% being over 55 years of age (particularly amongst cruise ship excursionists).

## What they thought of Gibraltar

For most categories of visitors around two thirds indicated that they would return to Gibraltar. Many visitors were pleased with their stay.

Various complaints and suggestions were noted and a summary of these is attached at Appendix 'B'.

Tables with detailed statistics are attached at Appendix 'C'.

Expenditure by visitor arrivals at hotels is therfore estimated at £2.9m as follows:

- 1. The average length of stay for staying visitors from Morocco makes allowance for visitors who only stay for one day i.e. excursionists. It was derived as follows:-  $(10758 \text{ excursionists x 1 day}) + (11,962 \text{ staying visitors x y days}) = 22720 \times 2 \text{ days})$ , so that y = 2.9

# (v) Visitors in Supplementary Accommodation

Out of a total of 40,583 visitors arrivals during 1976, 34933 stayed in hotels. It is therefore assumed that the remaining 5650 stayed in supplementary accommodation, mainly with family and friends

## (vi) In transit visitors

There were two types of in transit visitors in 1976,1439.

- 1439 air passengers from UK to Morocco
- 70 sea passengers from Mons Calpe going by air to UK.

Air passengers may or may not have the opportunity of leaving the air fraft and spend money in Gibraltar. It is practically impossible to work out a reliable estimate of expenditure, although a cautious estimate would be £3 per person per day.

The in-transit passengers from the Mons Calpe have more time and opportunity to spend money in Gibraltar and expenditure by person is estimated at £7.5.

Total expenditure for in-transit visitors is therefore around £5,000.
