VACANCY FOR CHIEF SURVEYOR

The Government of Gibraltar invites applications for appointment to the post of Chief Surveyor in the Gibraltar Maritime Administration from persons who by virtue of their citizenship are entitled to take up employment in Gibraltar and to travel without restriction within the EU.

This is an opportunity to join a Maritime Administration which is growing quickly. The tasks carried out by the Administration include: conducting ship surveys, flag and ILO inspections and ISM/ISPS audits of Gibraltar ships; PSC inspections; survey of harbour craft, examination of seafarers and approval of service providers for the maritime industry.

The successful applicant will have a positive approach and mature judgement; the drive to effectively manage tasks; the ability to motivate, manage and empower a team; sound analytical skill and experience in resolving difficult questions on the application of international maritime Conventions; and the ability to plan work schedules, delegate where appropriate and react quickly to changing priorities. Good IT skills and fluency in English are essential.
