JOB SPECIFICATION

GRADE: Trainee Marine Surveyor

DEPARTMENT: Gibraltar Maritime Administration

RESPONSIBLE TO: Senior Marine Surveyors

The appointment will be on temporary and non pensionable contract terms for a period of three years. Further employment is subject to satisfactory completion of the training program.

The following are the general training which all Trainee Marine Surveyors must undertake:

- The training requirements and the program will be dependent on qualifications and experience held by the applicants. The following will be the general training program.
 - A period of time shadowing a Gibraltar Maritime Administration surveyor and working under his direction whilst carrying out Port State Control Inspections and other surveys and audits both locally and abroad.
 - Up to six month secondment to the MCA and up to two month to the Headquarters of a classification society. The period of secondment may be varied if required.
 - Up to 4 months shadowing a class surveyor in the area of Cadiz and other areas in Spain.
 - Completion of the EMSA Seminar for New Entrants Port State Control Inspectors and other distance learning packages will also be required.
 - Successful completion of other specialised courses in such areas as the Loadline, Solas, Marpol, STCW, ISM, ISPS and the ILO Conventions.
 - Completion of a twelve month correspondence course to obtain a Diploma in Marine Surveying.
 - Attend such additional training courses as may be required.
- 2. As the trainee become competent in various tasks they will be required to carry out audits and surveys of, in the first instance, domestic vessels and subsequently vessels outside Gibraltar.
- 3. On successful completion of the training program the surveyor will have attained the required level of competency allowing him to carry out various functions, some of which will require re-validation every 5 years.

4. Failure to satisfactorily complete the training program will result in termination of the appointment.

In addition to the above, a Trainee Marine Surveyors will be required to undertake further specific duties in respect of the particular section in which the officer is deployed.
