JOB PROFILE:		

The successful candidate will need to perform skilled work in the maintenance and repair of vessels, marine engines, marine machinery and related equipment. Will need to regularly inspect and test engine equipment to pinpoint problems. Will need to address problems involving boat steering mechanisms or propellers, and will also be responsible for the procuring of necessary supplies, tools and equipment parts.

## The main duties and responsibilities of the post are:

- Perform major and specialised mechanical overhaul and repair work on marine engines, outboard motors, and related marine equipment and systems using schematic charts and technical manuals.
- Establish and maintain a preventive maintenance program for marine engines and related marine equipment.
- Test marine engines and equipment to determine need for repairs or adjustments.
- Repair and maintain hydraulic equipment and valves.
- Operate hand and power tools associated with marine engine and equipment repair.
- Assist in fabrication of equipment.
- Purchase parts and supplies.
- Write specifications for, and recommend purchase of marine equipment.

## WORKING CONDITIONS WILL INCLUDE

- Outdoor weather conditions;
- A non-stable environment (i.e. pitching, heaving, and rolling decks);
- Noisy environment;
- Hot and confined spaces;
- Exposure to toxic/caustic substances and fumes;
- Elevated areas (i.e. over six feet);
- Moving, lifting, and carrying heavy objects.

This job description reflects the general duties of the job but is not a detailed description of all duties which may be inherent to the position. The Royal Gibraltar Police may assign reasonably related additional duties to individual employees consistent with policy and agreements, as well as providing health and safety information, instruction, training and supervision when applicable and available.
