## **AUTUMN FESTIVAL 2009 - POETRY COMPETITION**

The Ministry for Culture, in conjunction with The Gibraltar Chronicle and The Department of Education & Training, will once again hold a Poetry Competition as part of its annual Autumn Festival.

The poetry competition is open to all Gibraltarians and residents in Gibraltar, who may submit a maximum of two original and unpublished works not exceeding 40 lines each.

The Ministry of Culture prize for the Overall Winner will be £300 and a trophy.

Additionally, there will be awards to the best entry received from students in each of the following school years:

- A. School Years 4 to 7
- B. School Years 8 to 11
- C. School Years 12 to 13

The winner of each school year group will receive a £50 voucher and a pen, both kindly donated by The Gibraltar Chronicle, and a trophy donated by the Ministry of Culture. The winning entries will be published in The Gibraltar Chronicle.

The Minister for Culture, Heritage, Sport & Leisure, the Hon Edwin Reyes, commented:

"I feel that the Poetry Competition is a great opportunity to make children and adults alike become more active participants in the field of literature. Therefore, I trust many budding poets will rise to the challenge of entering their own original masterpieces in what the Ministry for Culture and the Gibraltar Chronicle hope will become an annual event.
