Four Maritime Cadets Recruited

The Gibraltar Government has today announced the names of the four successful

applicants who will be taking up scholarship places in its Maritime Cadet Training

Scheme. Angelo Chipolina of Ramillies House, Adrian King of Kent House, Karim A

Lopez of Mount Road and Gareth Roman of Bellevue Vineyards House will spend the

next three years as from September, combining theoretical work at the Warsash

College of Nautical Studies, one of the top colleges for nautical cadets in the United

Kingdom and which enjoys a worldwide reputation for excellence, plus structured

practical experience at sea.

On successful completion, they will each receive a Certificate of Competence as an

Officer of the Watch, under the International Convention of Seafarers Training and

Certification and Watchkeeping (STCW). This is an internationally-recognised

qualification and allows the officers to serve on any merchant navy ship.

This Scheme was launched by the Government in 2005 to develop employment

opportunities within the maritime sector in Gibraltar by enabling two Gibraltarian

students to be recruited every year and trained as Engineering and Deck Officers

Cadets. It has been co-sponsored by Aegean Bunkering (Gibraltar) Ltd, Bunkers

(Gibraltar) Ltd, Cepsa (Gibraltar) Ltd, Marine Service Shipping (Gibraltar) Ltd and

Vemaoil Company Ltd.

The Minister with responsibility for Maritime Affairs, the Hon Joe Holliday said he was

pleased that, following presentations at Bayside School by the Captain of the Port,

Peter Hall and the Maritime Administrator, Alan Cubbin, and with the support of the

Department of Education and Training, nine students had applied and four have been

selected, the highest number since the scheme started.

Minister Holliday said: "These young men are part of the future of Gibraltar's very

successful and vibrant maritime industry and the Government is wholly committed to

encouraging more Gibraltarians to work in this sector. I wish them every success, as

they embark on the first steps of a career which could see them reach the top ranks

of the Gibraltar Port Authority, Gibraltar Maritime Administration or Gibraltar Pilots."
