FESTIVAL OF LIGHTS

The Ministry of Culture has announced the programme of events for this year's Festival of Lights on Friday 22nd November 2013. The events are being organised by the Ministry of Culture in collaboration with the Gibraltar Electricity Authority (GEA) and shall be held at John Mackintosh Square.

The entertainment will be presented by Rock Masters and commences at 6pm with live music, song and dance. The switching-on of the Christmas Lights at 7pm will be conducted by Minister of Culture, the Hon Steven Linares, His Worship the Mayor Anthony Lima and Tyrone Davies from St Martin's School. Father Christmas and his elves will also be making a special appearance.
