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Dementia Information session for relatives

Given prevalence of dementia in our society, the Care Agency understands how difficult it is for relatives of people with dementia, and it recently organised an informative session on dementia for relatives of residents at Mount Alvernia, Jewish Home, John Cochrane Ward and Calpe Ward. Members of the Dementia & Alzheimer Society were also invited. The talk was delivered by the GHA's consultant geriatrician, Dr Marin and psychologist, Dr Camino.

The talk was aimed at understanding the disease, managing it and informing relatives of the support available for them. It included advice on early detection of the disease and the current treatment available in which the disease may be delayed.
