EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST

Her Majesty's Government of Gibraltar (HM GoG) invites expressions of interest from developers, investors or organisations interested in developing the KGV site in South Barrack Road. The site also includes the previous Bishop Healy Home. HM GoG is not at this stage restricting the future use of the site and is open to ideas and proposals.



Schemes may need to take account of Heritage and Planning considerations related to the original buildings and the height of any new buildings should not exceed the level of Europa Road and South Barrack Road.

Interested parties should understand that submissions need only be initial expressions of interest, but should include basic details of any concepts including preliminary layout plans and sketches. They should also state uses of particular areas and the premium that would be offered if the submission is selected by HM GoG for further negotiation and discussion. HM GoG reserves the right to negotiate the level of premium. A process of consultation and negotiation will follow with parties that submit ideas or concepts that are of interest to HM GoG. Such concepts, ideas or proposals may need to evolve or be adapted as discussions or negotiations move forward.

Outline layout plans and details should be submitted with letters of interest. These should be marked "KGV Site Expressions of Interest" and submitted sealed and addressed to HM Government of Gibraltar and deposited in the Expressions of Interest Box situated at the offices of Land Property Services Limited, 50 Town Range, Gibraltar, not later than noon on Friday 29th May 2015. Envelopes will remain sealed until after the closing date. HM GoG reserves the right to reject any or all submissions.
