Two senior members of staff from the Gibraltar Port Authority recently attended a two day Search and Rescue (SAR) conference hosted by the UK's Maritime and Coastguard Agency and several other sponsors, bringing together maritime and aviation SAR professionals from all over the world. The conference, which took place in Brighton also included an exhibition, demonstrations, workshops, and debates on topics including humanitarian and disaster response, migrant offshore aid stations and the role of non-government organisations in search and rescue operations.
