GRADE: Vehicle Tester

DEPARTMENT: Driver and Vehicle Licencing Department

RESPONSIBLE TO: Driving and Vehicle Examiner

The main duties and responsibilities of the post are:

Vehicle Testing:

- a. To examine all types of motor vehicles (including trailers and semitrailers), in accordance with EU and any International Obligation, using the vehicle testing plant and equipment.
- b. To ensure that all vehicles presented for registrations are examined in accordance with the law.
- c. To carry out the duties of Transport Inspector for the purposes of examining and issuing Certificate of Fitness or Authority in accordance with the provisions of the Transport Act.
- d. To conduct roadside tests as set out within the relevant legislation.
- e. To examine vehicles involved in traffic accidents, and subsequently give specialist evidence in court, when necessary.
- f. To undertake the maintenance and assist in the calibration of all equipment used for vehicle testing.
- g. To undertake any duties appropriate to their post that may come about as a result of any changes to EU or domestic legislation.
- h. To check seals and validity of speed limiter plate.
- i. To check seals and validity of tachograph plate.
- j. To collect information and keep data on work carried out as required by Management.
- k. To operate lanes 2 and 3 with a compliment of three Vehicle Testers only in exceptional circumstances.

Other:

a. To carry out any other duties appropriate to the post as required by the Chief Examiner or the Senior Driver and Vehicle Examiner.
