



**NOTICE OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT  
(NPA 16/2025)**

**CIVIL AVIATION REGULATIONS  
SAFETY MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS  
(CAR SMS)**

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## 1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Gibraltar Civil Aviation Authority (GCAA) continues to ensure that it has the most up to date aviation regulatory system by developing operating regulations under the Civil Aviation Act, Section 34(1), which are easy for the aviation industry to understand and navigate.
- 1.2 A Notice of Proposed Amendment (**NPA**) is a public notice that is issued when the GCAA wishes to add, remove, or change operating regulations as part of the rulemaking process. The following is a description of a new edition, any major change, (apart from minor editorial corrections) that were made to these regulations;
- (a) CAR SMS (Civil Aviation Regulations – Safety Management Systems) is a new regulation and has been developed from ICAO Annex 19.
  - (b) CAR SMS addresses the GCAA and applicable operator/organisation requirements for a safety management system.
- 1.3 The purpose of this NPA is to:
- (a) introduce formal public consultation on the proposed CAR;
  - (b) ensure the adequacy of legislation governing operations of Gibraltar registered aircraft in accordance with ICAO SARPS and international best regulatory practices; and
  - (c) determine the effect on the aircraft operators/organisations of the proposed legislation.
- 1.4 The GCAA now seeks comments on this NPA from the aviation industry and the concerned parties before proceeding further.

## 2. OBJECTIVE

- 2.1 The objective of this NPA is to advise all concerned parties of the proposed changes and to obtain comments regarding these changes. A number of regulatory criteria have been identified to guide the development of these changes. The criteria require that the new legislation/regulations should:
- (a) be clear, concise and unambiguous;
  - (b) be consistent with the GCAA's international obligations;
  - (c) be harmonised with ICAO SARPS and international standards, unless unique GCAA circumstances require otherwise; and

(d) be enforceable.

### **3. EFFECT OF CHANGES**

- 3.1 The persons/organisations affected by the proposed new regulation are expected to be persons and organisations required to have a safety management system.
- 3.2 All persons affected by these regulations are requested to review the changes and determine the effect on their particular circumstances.
- 3.3 The effective date for CAR SMS is planned for **01 February 2026**.

### **4. PRESENTATION**

- 4.1 Once promulgated, the new regulation will be available in electronic format on the GCAA website under "CARs".

### **5. HOW TO SUBMIT COMMENTS ON THIS NPA**

All submissions must be received by 19 January 2026 and will be evaluated and assessed with a view to incorporating any necessary changes to the regulations prior to their formal promulgation. In order to simplify collation and summarising of comments, the GCAA will accept an email or letter together with the Response Sheet (refer to page 4/5) and any additional comments attached as necessary.
