WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE AN ALLY?

- To accept and support the LGBTQ+ community.
- To have strong and genuine concerns for the well-being of the LGBTQ+ community.
- To advocate for equal rights and fair treatment.
- To stand up to challenges faced by the LGBTQ+ community.



THE IMPORTANCE OF BEING AN ALLY

Allies are welcomed by the LGBTQ+ community, they can be effective and a strong voice when defending LGBTQ+ issues. They can provide a link between people who do not understand the issues affecting the LGBTQ+ community and also make LGBTQ+ people feel comfortable to be themselves.

HOW TO BE AN ALLY

<u>Be Informed</u>: Stay up to date with the current issues that affect the LGBTQ+ community. If you do not know about the difference between sexual orientation, gender identity, or expression, ask or read our Trans Ally leaflet.


Be Heard: It can be awkward or difficult to correct someone when they use a word or sentence that can offend others, it is here where you can make a difference and educate someone, and prevent them from saying it in the future.

Words can hurt.

Be Honest: Do not be afraid to talk about people who are close to you who are LGBTQ+. If they are open about their sexual orientation and/or identity and do not mind.

Be Supportive: Especially when new policies that are designed to protect LGBTQ+ people are rolled out. If you see a rule or policy that is not right, talk to a trusted person about your concerns

Be open about being an Ally: Let others know about you being an ally, do not shy about it, the more awareness that is created, the quicker the society will become more inclusive.







Anyone, regardless of their gender identity and/or orientation can be an LGBTQ+ Ally. As Gibraltar becomes a more inclusive society, it is important to be able to understand how to support LGBTQ+ people.
