

### What goes in the brown bin?

All organic waste which is any material that is biodegradable and comes from either plant or animal sources. Biodegradable waste can breakdown easily in nature.

**Some examples include**: leftover fruit and vegetables, scraps of meat and fish, the shells of eggs, seafood and nuts, coffee grounds, tea bags, and small garden waste such as leaves and flowers.





What goes in the green bin?

Anything made from glass can be recycled in the green recycling bin.

**Some examples include**: bottles of wine, spirits etc, jam jars, perfume bottles, window panes, drinking glass and glass plates or bowls.









## What goes in the orange bin?

All types of oils used in cooking can be recycled in the orange recycling bin

Please dispose of waste cooking oil in a suitable plastic container to avoid any spillage. No waste car oil to be be placed in this recycling bin.





# What goes in the yellow bin?

Anything made out of plastic, tetrabrik and metal can be recycled in the yellow recycling bin.

**Some examples include**: Polystyrene boxes, biscuit, chocolate and crisp wrappers, drink bottles, plastic take-away containers, shampoo bottles, milk cartons, juice cartons, tomato sauce containers, drink cans, food tins, broken metal cutlery, aluminium foil, metal bottle caps and lids.





### What goes in the pink bin?

Anything that uses electricity to work can be recycled in the pink recycling bin.

**Some examples include**: IT and telecommunications equipment (computers, laptops, keyboards, printers, etc), telephones and mobiles, chargers, lightbulbs, clocks, watches, battery powered toys, electronic tools, kettles, DVDs, electric tooth-brushes, toasters, irons, radios and video games.





### What goes in the blue bin?

Anything made out of paper can be recycled in the blue recycling bin.

**Some examples include**: Newspapers, magazines, cardboard, egg cartons, cardboard food packaging, boxes, wrapping paper, birthday and christmas cards.
