



Chart 2.02 Civilian Population of Gibraltar, 1961, 1970, 1981, 1991, 2001 and 2012







Civilian Population, 1961, 1970, 1981, 1991, 2001 and 2012

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

Population and Persons Present in Gibraltar on Census night, 2012



Births by Age of Mother, 2016



Marriages (Residents) in Gibraltar, 2005 - 2016



















Industrial Accidents by Nature of Injury, 2016









Total Visitor Arrivals by Air, 2016








Chart 18.04 Monthly Maximum and Minimum Air Temperatures, 2015 - 2016





